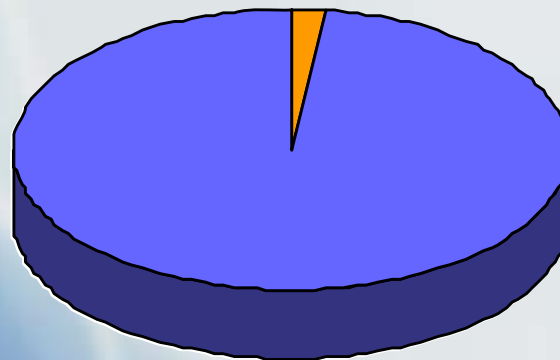

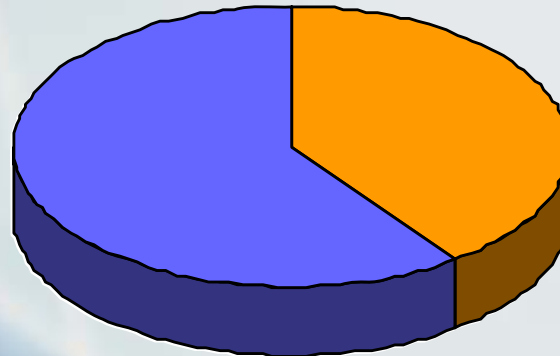

■ ORA = 60% of FDA



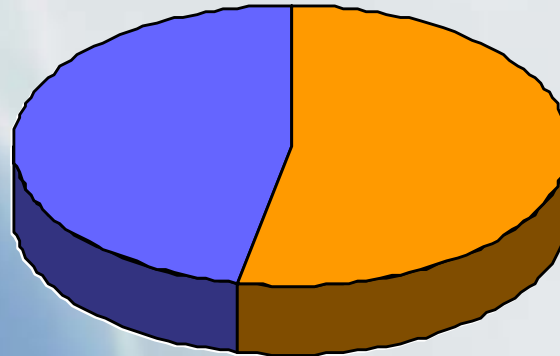
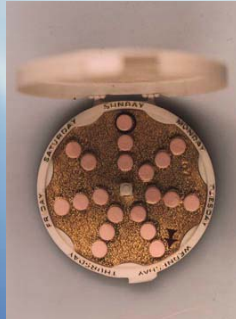

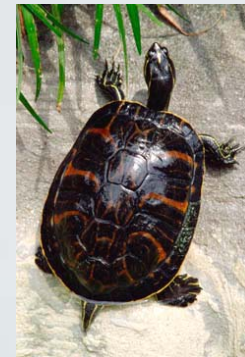
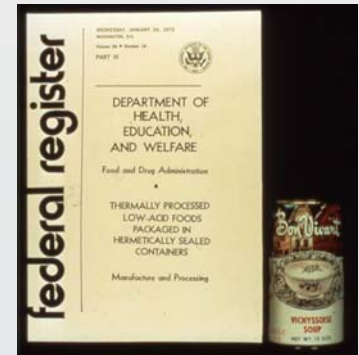


Added Responsibilities

■ ORA = 47% of FDA (2,203 FTEs)



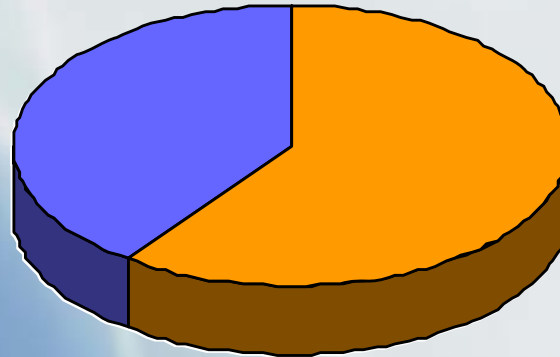
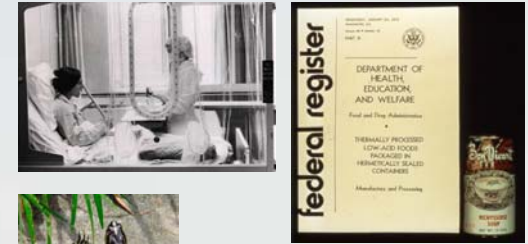

■ ORA = 40% of FDA (4,027 FTEs)



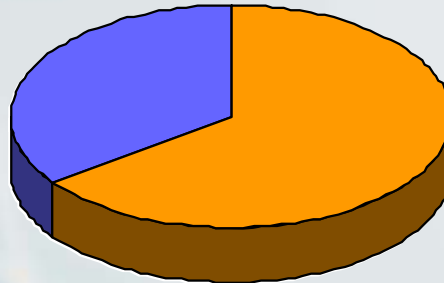

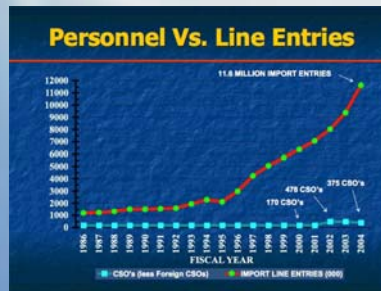


Added Responsibilities

Personnel Vs. Line Entries



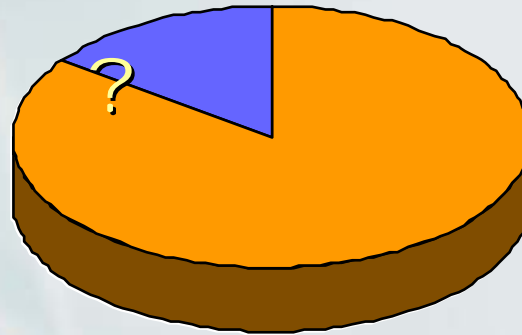
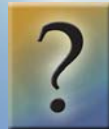
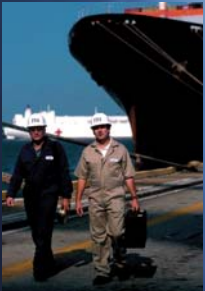
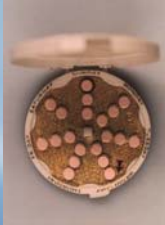

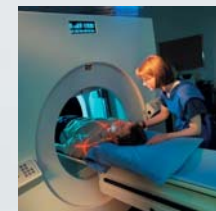
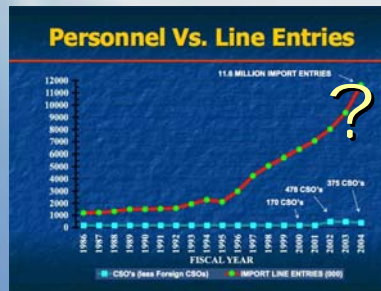


Added Responsibilities
