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



Statistics

- September 6th: Irma, a Cat 5 passes north of Puerto Rico leaving 1 Million with out power.
- September 20th: Maria, a powerful Category 4 storm plowed across the island with sustained winds of 155 mph, uprooting trees, downing weather stations and cell towers, and ripping wooden and tin roofs off homes. Electricity was cut off to 100% of the island, and access to clean water and food became limited for most.










Incident Management Group (IMG)





Basic IMG Structure






SJN-IMT: Command and Control

- Logistics: MREs/Water/Communications
- Safety: Most Roads Closed
- Temporary Relief Center- Phones/Wifi/Showers
