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Inspecting the Body Art Establishment



Inspectors should:

- Properly identify themselves
- Ask questions
- Look at all areas of establishment
- Observe set up, take down, and part of procedure

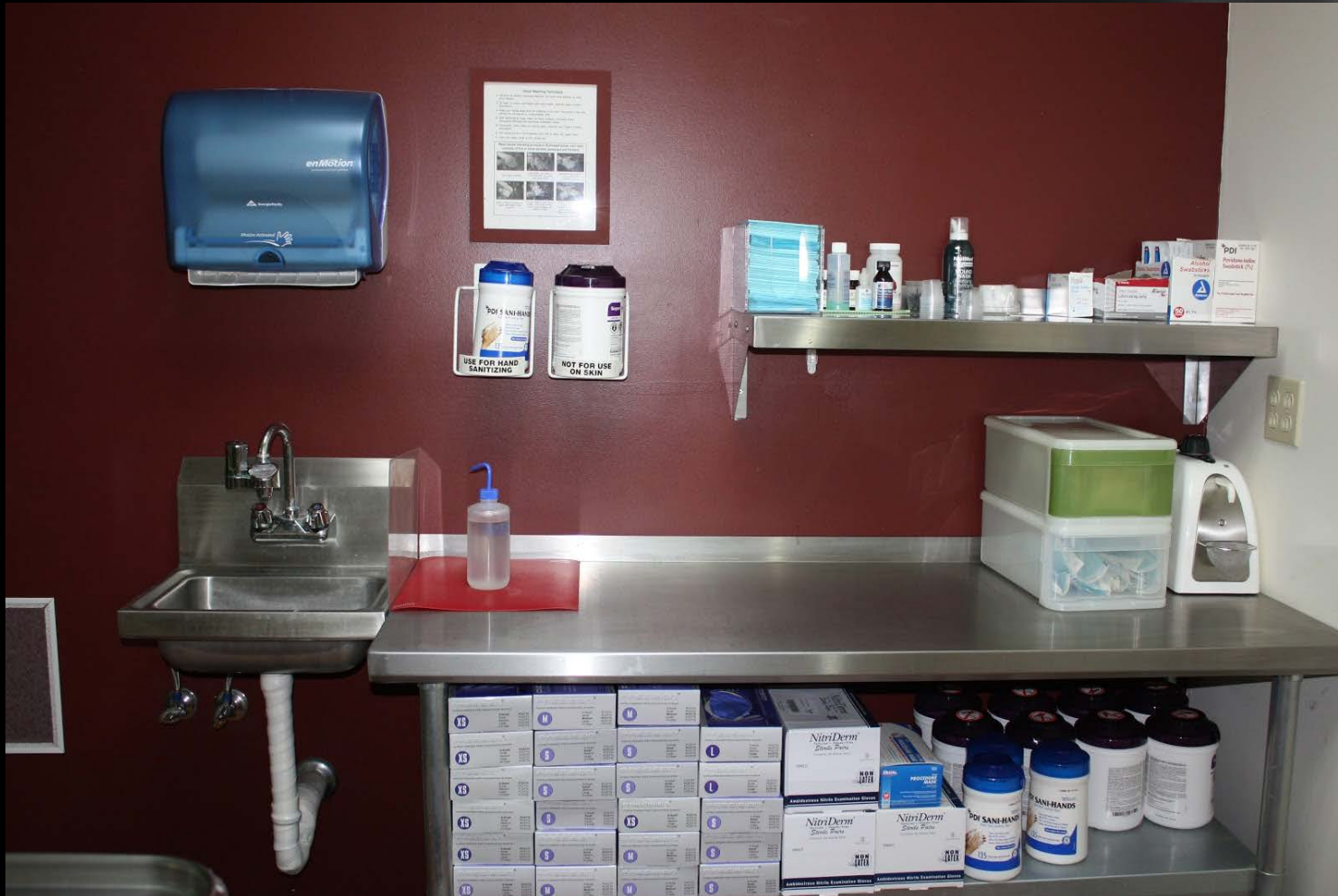
Procedure Area



All body art procedures areas shall be completely separated by solid partitions or by walls extending from floor to ceiling from any room used for something other than body art procedures within a registered body art facility.

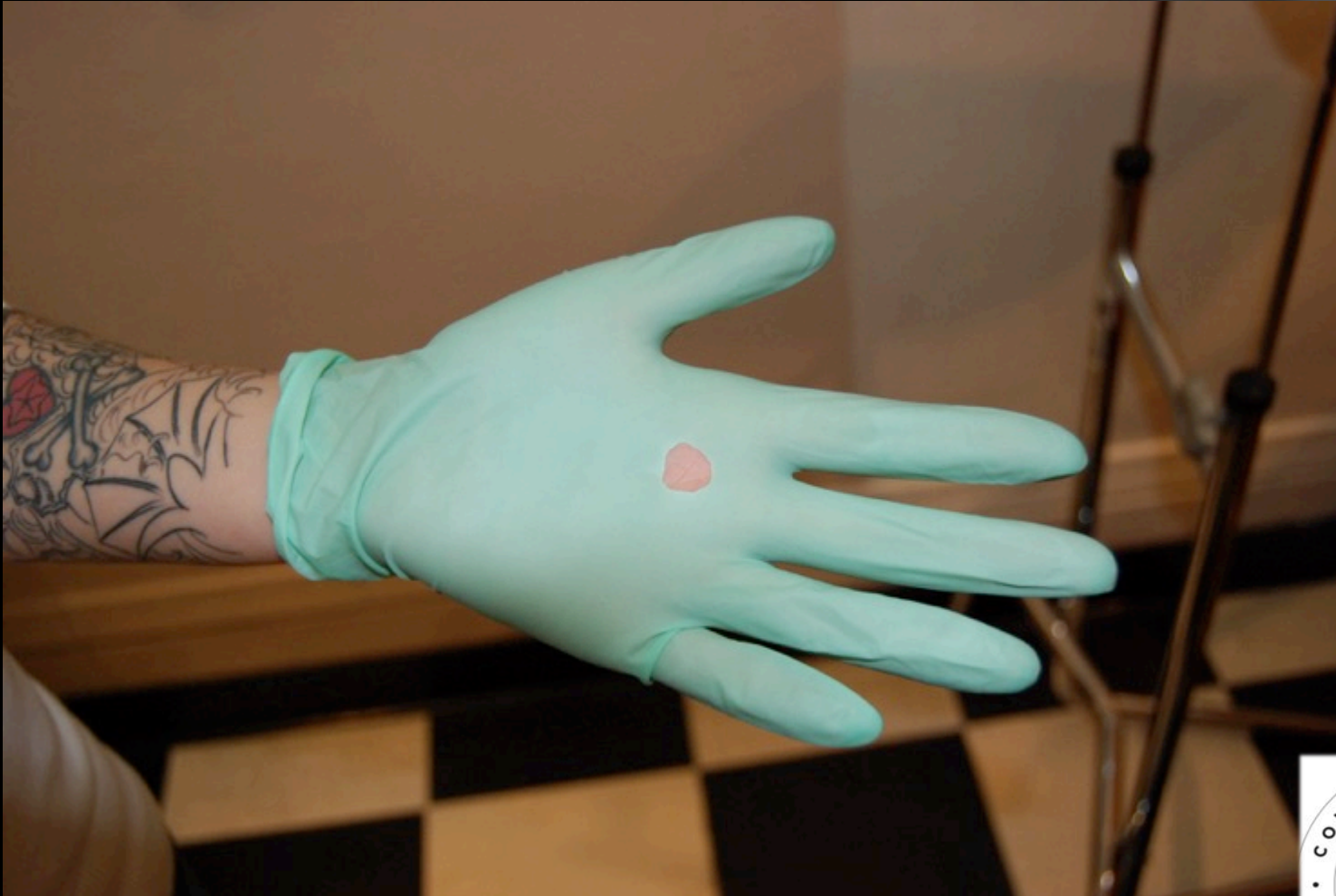
Proper Hand Hygiene



Don a fresh pair of gloves



A compromised glove requires a glove change



Personal Protective Equipment



Cover all client surfaces with appropriate protective disposables



All surfaces for the client shall be non-porous or properly prepared with appropriate disposable protective equipment. All pillows must be covered with a barrier.



Proper Set Up for Procedure



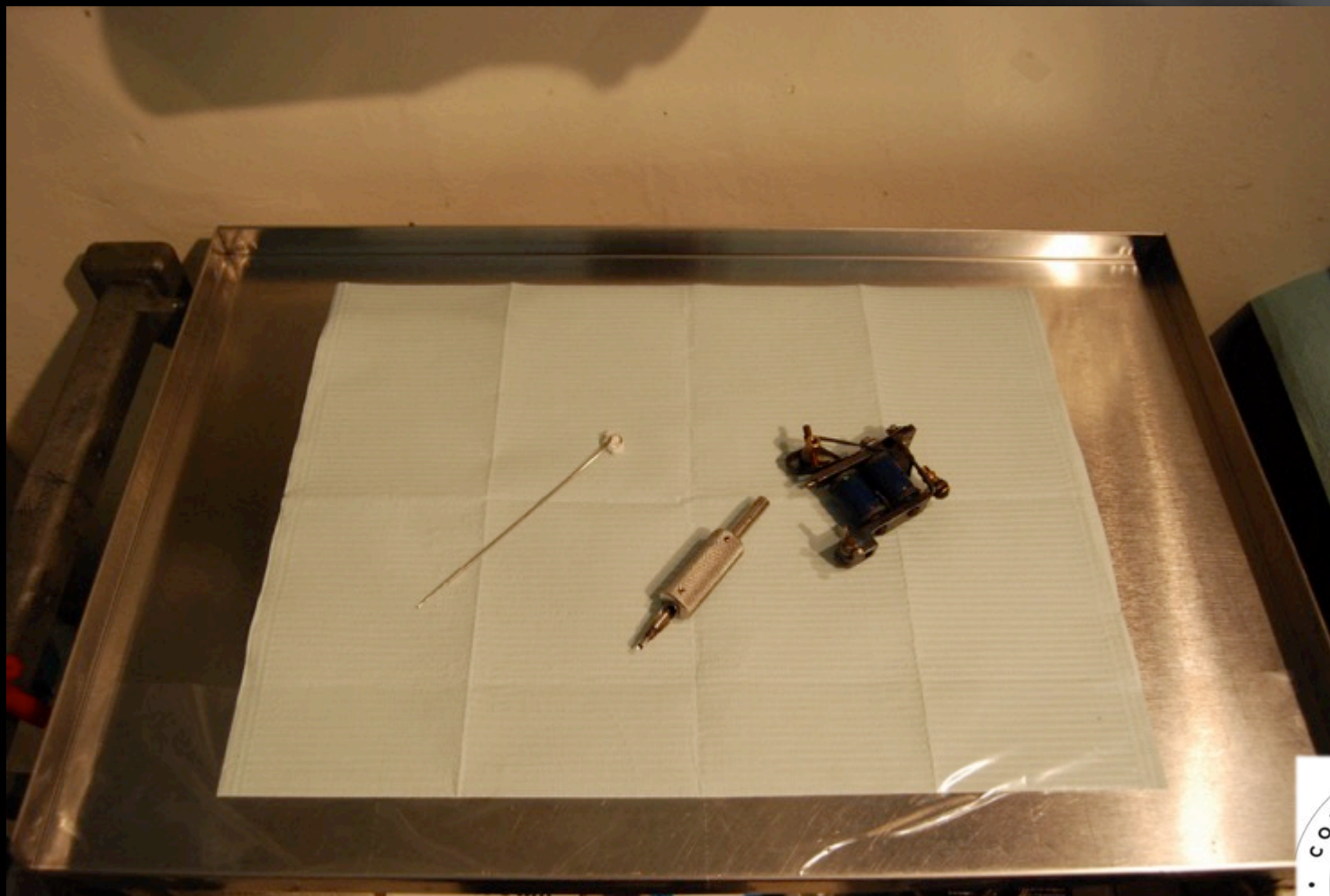
Inspect your packages carefully before use!



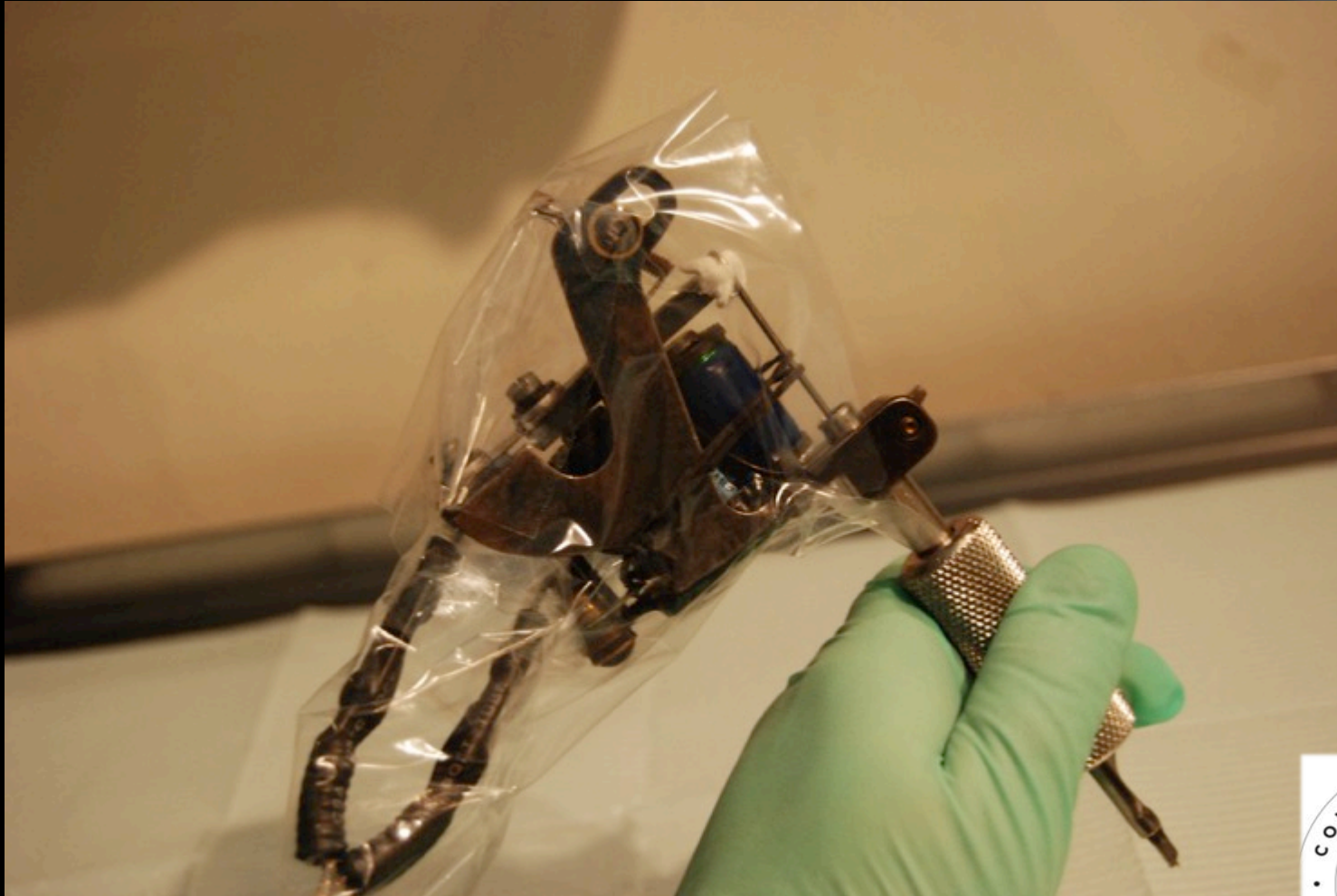
Use a disposable receptacle for all commercially manufactured ink used during the procedure



Tattoo machine must have removable parts to prevent backflow into enclosed parts of the motor



Use clip cord covers and machine bags



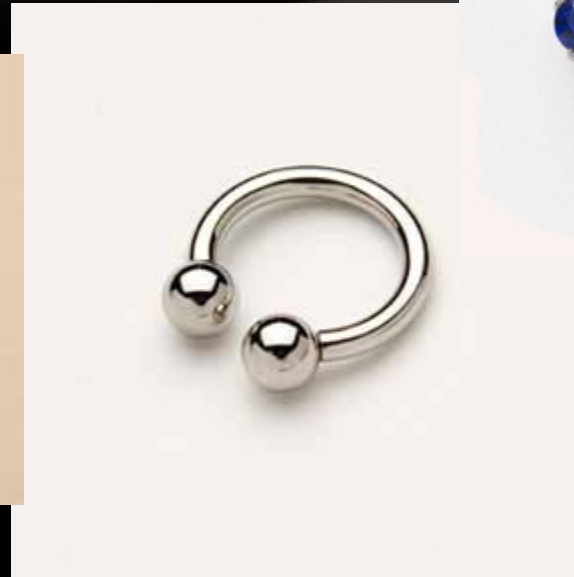
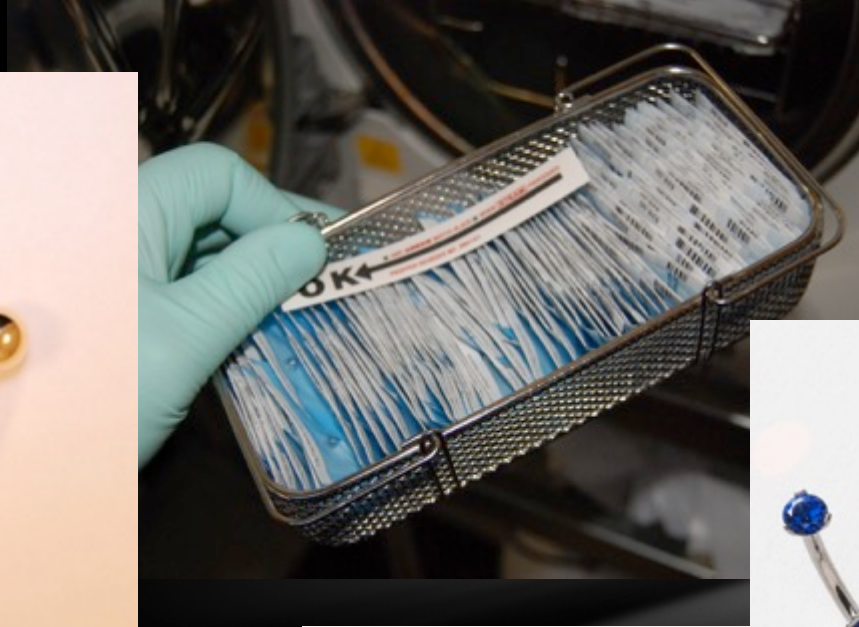
Peel apart packages can be used as sterile surface to work from



Pre-sterilized measuring calipers



Jewelry must be sterilized and of a biocompatible material



Use only single use disposable razors for any shaving of the area and dispose of in the sharps container after use.



Sterilized pre-packs



Prep your surface properly



Mark with disposable single use marking pens



Discard Marking Pens After Use




Discard transfer paper after use



All needles must be purchased pre sterilized or sterilized in house



Keep records of all pre sterilized items purchased

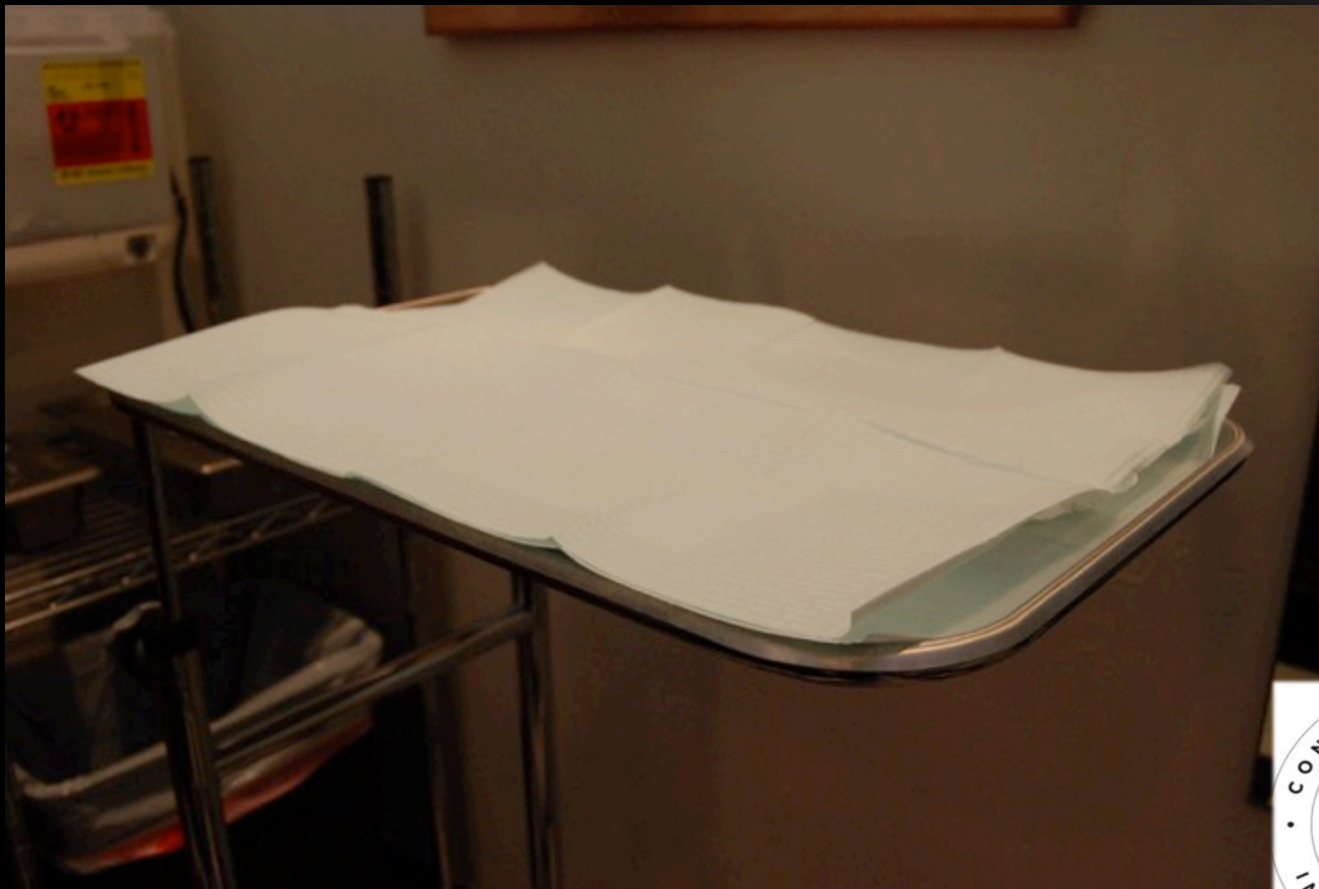

Cover your procedure area if you leave the area for any reason during a procedure



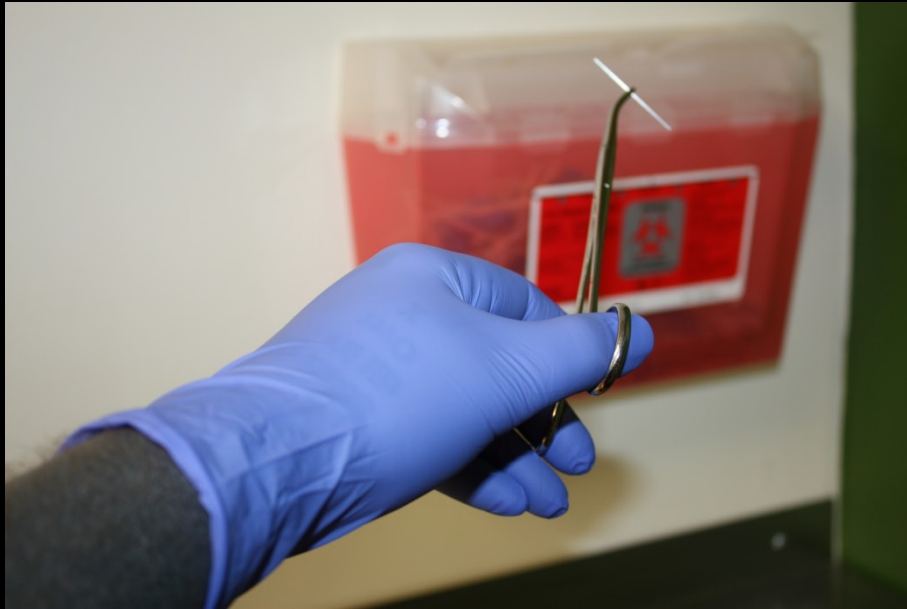
Temporarily place items to be processed into a basin.

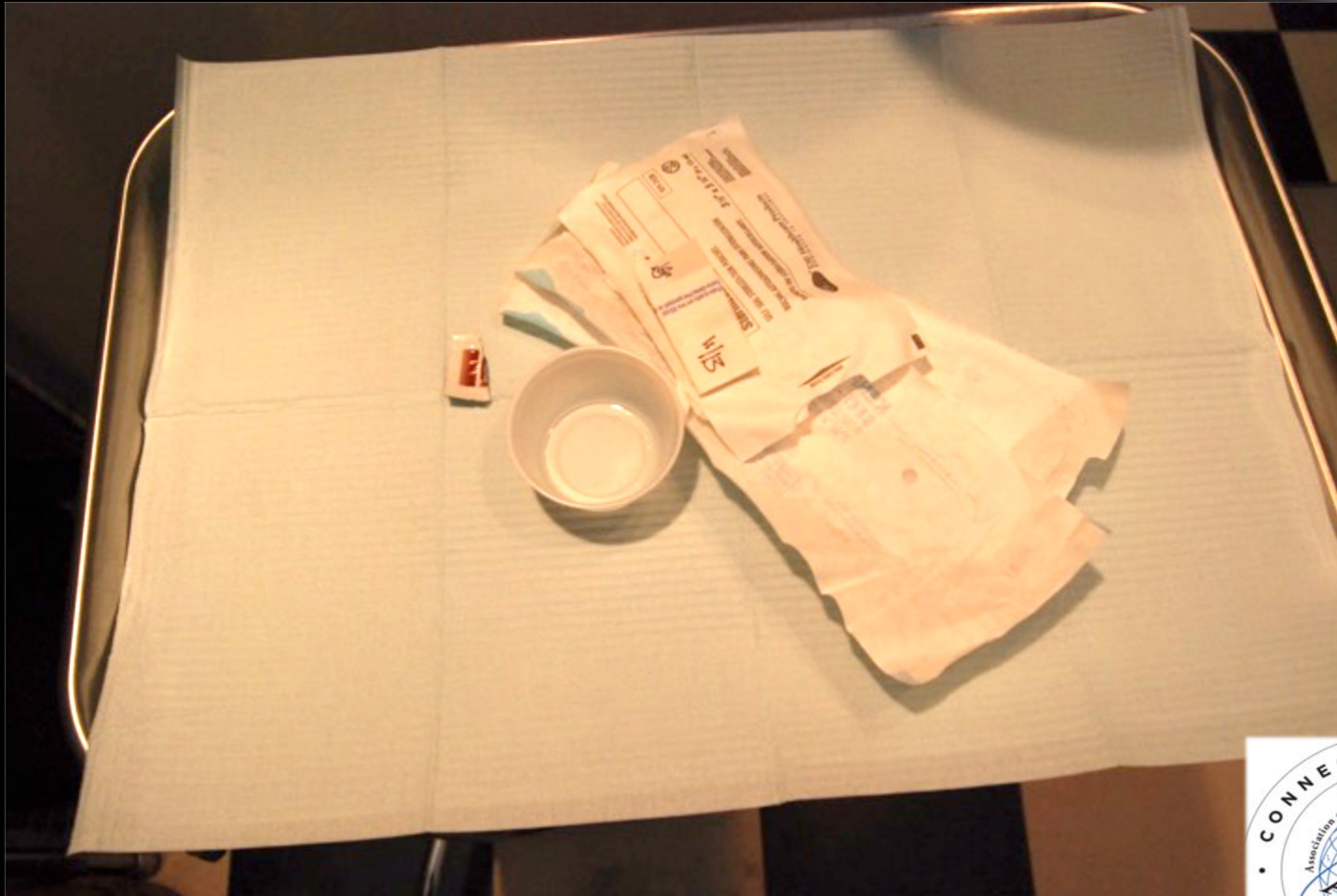

Gather all disposables



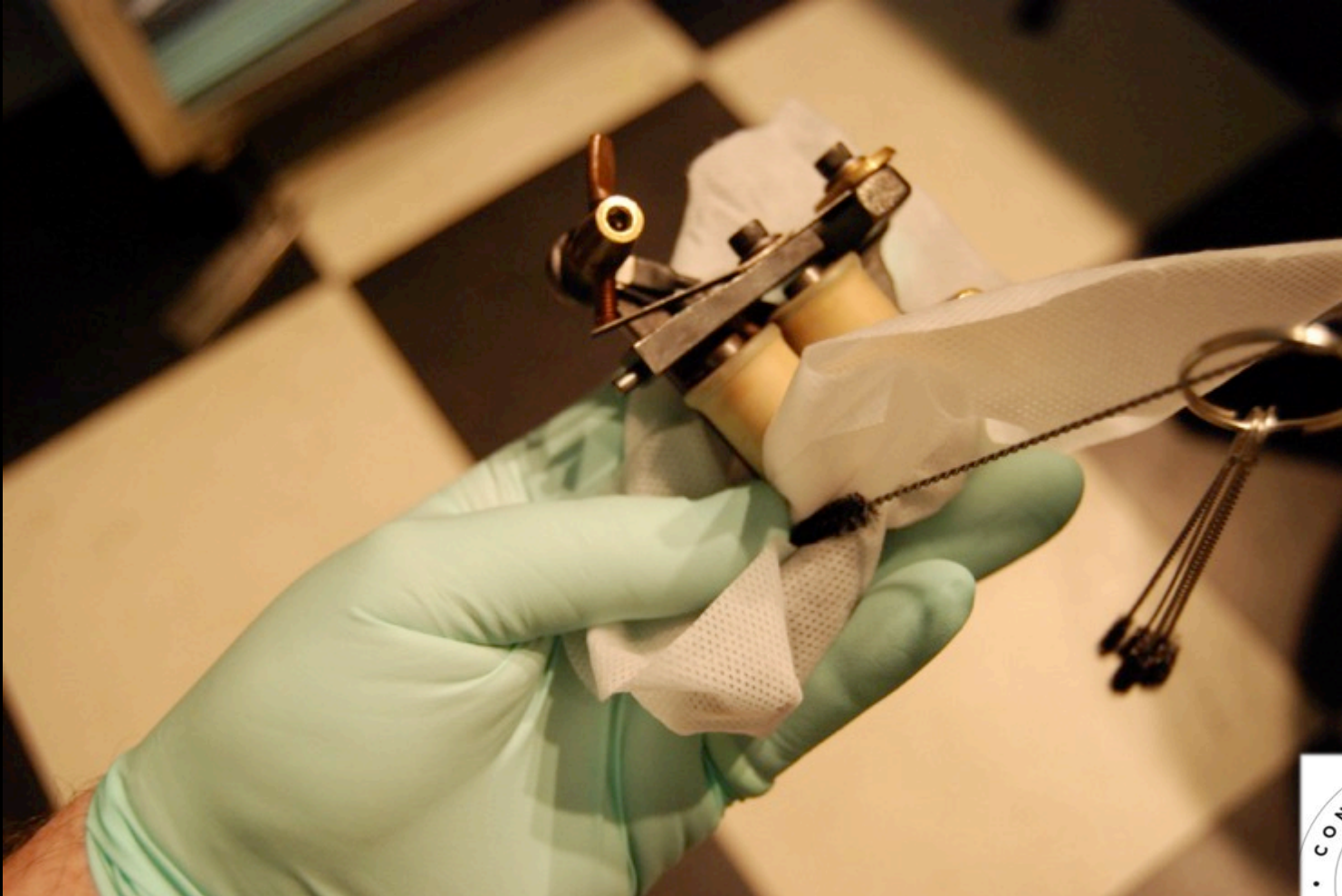
Bundle your disposables into a glove if you want to keep your trash bin tidy



Carefully carry your basin to the
decontamination and sterilization area



Clean all instruments that do not come into contact



Once your workstation is clear, disinfect
with proper disinfectant



Decontaminate all surfaces after use



Provide your customer with aftercare materials



Provide aftercare advice to your client



The decontamination and sterilization area is restricted to BBP trained personnel.



Apply appropriate personal protective equipment upon entering the decontamination and sterilization area



Remove all PPE when exiting the decontamination and sterilization area



Items to be processed



Use a brush small enough to clean
inside any hollow items or tools



Needle tubes in ultrasonic cleaner



Your ultrasonic cleaning cycle time may vary with load size and age of equipment



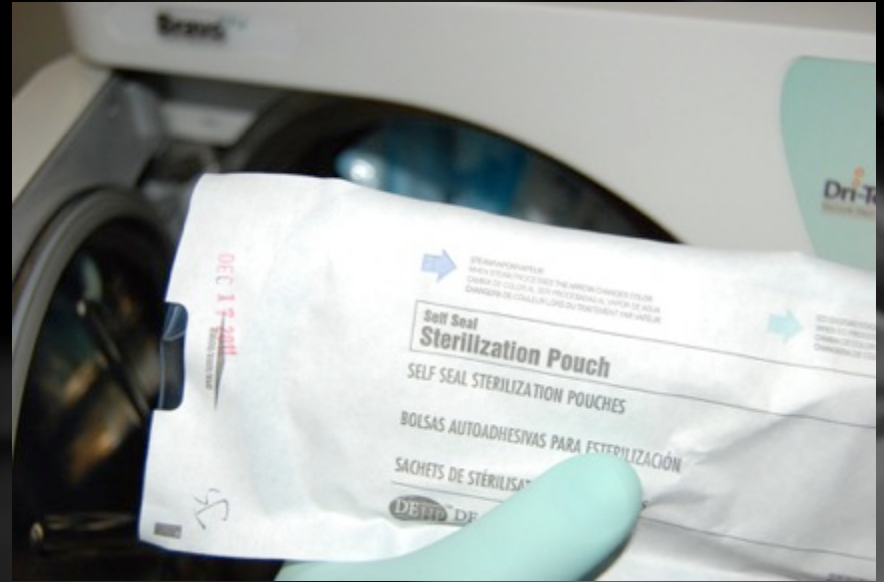
If your ultrasonic is not equipped with a drain carefully drain it manually



Cleaned items to dry before packaging them to be sterilized



Items in peel packs for sterilization



If your packages do not have an indicator on them enclose one with your item



Properly packed chamber autoclave



Class V integrator in every load



Sterilization Equipment Maintenance

Studio should have:

- Manufacturer's recommended procedures
- Maintenance records
- Spore tests
- Sterilization records

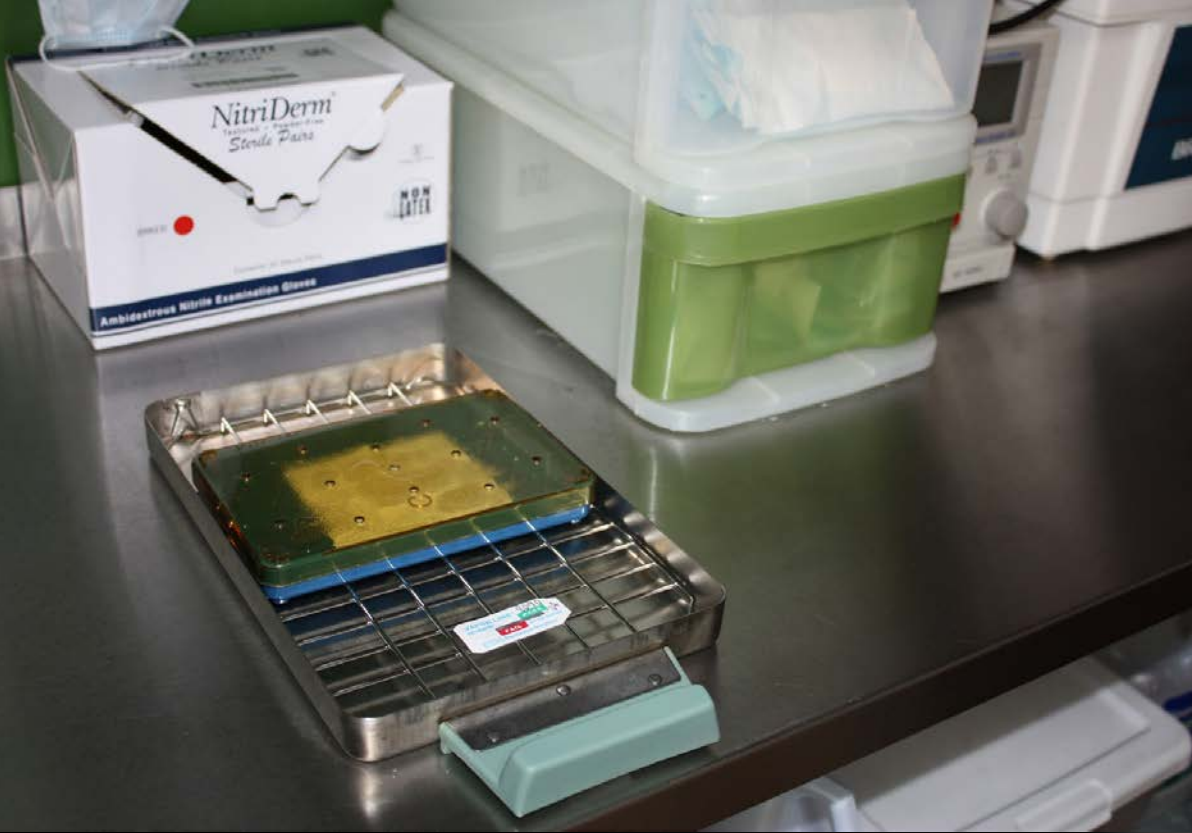
