





rules and regulations for carrying out the provisions of this Act. including the collection and examination of specimens of foods and drugs manufactured or offered for sale in the District of Columbia, or in any Territory of the United States, or which shall be offered for sale in unbroken packages in any State other than that in which they shall have been respectively manufactured or produced, or which shall be received from any foreign country, or intended for shipment to any foreign country, or which may be submitted for examination by the chief health, food, or drug officer of any State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, or at any domestic or foreign port through which such product is offered for interstate commerce, or for export or import between the United States and any foreign port or country.

SEC. 4. That the examinations of specimens of foods and drugs shall the examinations be made in the Bureau of Chemistry of the Department of Agriculture, or under the direction and supervision of such Bureau, for the . purpose of determining from such examinations whether such articles are adulterated or misbranded within the meaning of this Act; and if it shall appear from any such examination that any of such specimens is adulterated or misbranded within the meaning of this Act, the Secretary of Agriculture shall cause notice thereof to be given to the party from whom such sample was obtained. Any party so notified shall be given an opportunity to be heard, under such rules and regulations as may be prescribed as aforesaid, and if it appears that any of the pro- Certificate of violavisions of this Act have been violated by such party, then the Secre- ney. tary of Agriculture shall at once certify the facts to the proper United States district attorney, with a copy of the results of the analysis or the examination of such article duly authenticated by the analyst or officer making such examination, under the oath of such officer. After judgment of the court, notice shall be given by publication in such manner as may be prescribed by the rules and regulations aforesaid.

SEC. 5. That it shall be the duty of each district attorney to whom the Secretary of Agriculture shall report any violation of this Act, or to whom any health or food or drug officer or agent of any State, Territory, or the District of Columbia shall present satisfactory evidence of any such violation, to cause appropriate proceedings to be commenced and prosecuted in the proper courts of the United States, without delay, for the enforcement of the penalties as in such case herein provided.

SEC. 6. That the term "drug," as used in this Act, shall include all medicines and preparations recognized in the United States Pharmacopecia or National Formulary for internal or external use, and any substance or mixture of substances intended to be used for the cure. mitigation of program and the set of the effet, mitigation of program and the set of the effet, The term "food," as used herein, shall include all of other animals, food, drink, convertionery, or condiment by man or other animals, whether simple, mixed, or compound.

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The degree of regulation and proper controls of refrigerated and frozen pet food is relatively unknown.



Research Questions

- 1. Do regulatory agencies have the authority to inspect retail establishments that hold refrigerated or frozen pet food?
- 2. Do regulatory agencies have the authority to enforce corrective actions for facility violations at retail establishments?
- 3. How well do pet food establishments that hold refrigerated or frozen pet food control the risks associated with the product?



Methodology

Surveys on:

- 1. Regulatory Authority
- 2. Certain Risk Factors

Surveys were piloted and distributed through AAFCO

Results submitted via email and analyzed for:

- Statistical conclusions
- Prevalence of answers




Study Population

- 1. State and local agencies, their program managers and inspectors that have regulatory authority of refrigerated or frozen pet food.
- 2. Establishments that manufacture, process, hold, or distribute refrigerated or frozen pet food.




Results

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

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






TYPE OF ESTABLISHMENT WHERE RISK SURVEY WAS PERFORMED



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




Storage hierarchy and separation was conducted properly 100% of the time.

Conclusions

- Research question #1 Do regulatory agencies have the authority to inspect retail establishments that hold refrigerated or frozen pet food?
 - Most surveyed agencies have authority to inspect nearly all establishments that handle refrigerated or frozen pet food, including retail.
 - Retail establishments low priority with infrequent inspections.
 - When retail establishments are visited, it is mainly for sampling or label checks.
 - Small percentage of animal food inspectors carry thermometers.



Conclusions (continued)

- **Research question #2 –** Do regulatory agencies have the authority to enforce corrective actions for facility violations at retail establishments?
 - Most surveyed agencies have enforcement authority over the products themselves.
 - Very few agencies can enforce corrective actions at retail establishments.
 - Therefore, no effective means to resolve potential contributing factors or root cause of a problem.
 - Refrigerated and frozen pet food products are in a wide variety of establishments indicates this trend will be here for the long term.



Conclusions (continued)

- **Research question #3 –** How well do pet food establishments that hold refrigerated or frozen pet food control the risks associated with the product?
 - In the small amount of cooler and freezer units observed, issues were still identified.
 - Study conducted in the winter months which makes mechanical stresses of higher external temperatures less likely.
 - Product packages were in good condition and had proper storage hierarchy.
 - Inconsistent or not complete safe handling instructions provided on product labels.










RISK CATEGORY ASSIGNED TO PET FOOD RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS





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


TYPE OF ESTABLISHMENT WHERE RISK SURVEY WAS PERFORMED





% OF ESTABLISHMENTS THAT HELD REFRIGERATED AND FROZEN PET FOOD






% OF WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR COOLERS/FREEZERS?






% OF ESTABLISHMENTS THAT KEEP TEMPERATURE LOGS





% OF TYPE OF REFRIGERATED OR FROZEN HELD



% OF PRODUCTS OBSERVED WITH SAFE HANDLING INSTRUCTIONS


