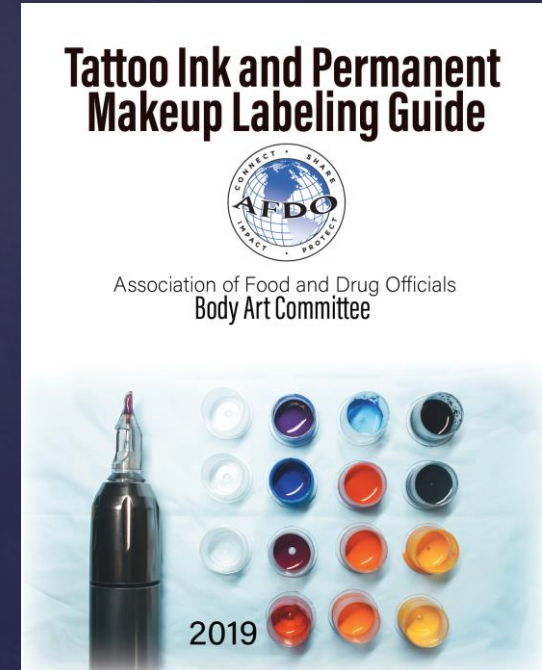

- ⌘ Significant knowledge gap pertaining to what happens to the pigment inside the body

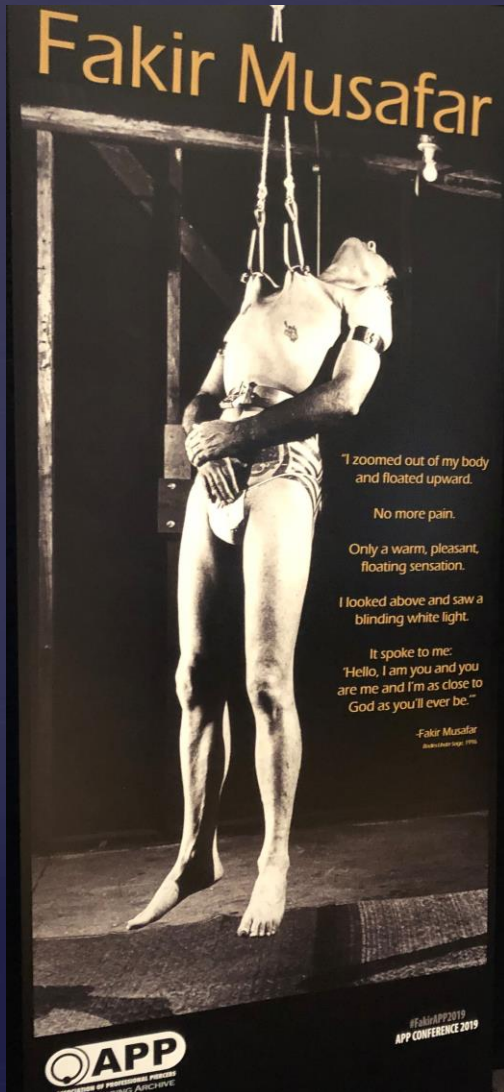


# Charges 3 & 4 – Body Art Establishment Inspection Guide and Checklist & Collaboration
